Two-in-Five Canadians Would Like Obama to Become U.S. President

Democratic presidential candidates viewed favourably by more than half of respondents in Canada.

[VANCOUVER – May 27, 2008] – Canadian adults appear to have a clear favourite in this year's United States presidential election, an Angus Reid Strategies poll has found.

In the online survey of a representative national sample, 43 per cent of respondents say they would like to see Democrat Barack Obama win this year's ballot in the U.S., while 29 per cent would prefer a victory by Democrat Hillary Rodham Clinton. Republican John McCain is a distant third with 12 per cent, and 16 per cent of respondents do not express a preference for any of the three main contenders.

Obama is more popular in Quebec (49%) and Manitoba and Saskatchewan (47%). In addition, almost half of Canadians with at least one university degree (49%) and those over the age of 55 (47%) want the Illinois Senator to win this year's presidential election in the U.S.

Rodham Clinton is the choice for more than a third of female respondents (35%). McCain fares poorly with Canadian women (5%), and gets his highest marks with older Canadians (16%), Albertans (21%) and residents of Manitoba and Saskatchewan (22%).

From May 21 to May 22, 2008 Angus Reid Strategies conducted an online survey among a randomly selected, representative sample of 1,005 adult Canadians. The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 3.1 %, 19 times out of 20. The results have been statistically weighted according to the most current education, age, gender and region Census data to ensure a sample representative of the entire adult population of Canada. Discrepancies in or between totals are due to rounding.

When asked about their opinion of the three politicians who are seeking the nomination of the two major American parties, two-thirds of Canadians (66%) express favourable views on Obama, and more than half (56%) feel the same way about Rodham Clinton. Half of Canadians (51%) provide negative feedback on McCain. Obama actually garners a higher





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favourability score than "Americans in general" (62%). Very few Canadians hold favourable views on both the U.S. government (22%) and current president George W. Bush (10%).

The survey asked Canadians to state which U.S. president has been Canada's greatest friend since 1969, when Richard Nixon took over from Lyndon B. Johnson. Bill Clinton—who governed from 1993 to 2001—is the choice for 31 per cent of respondents, followed by Ronald Reagan with 20 per cent, and Jimmy Carter with 14 per cent. While one-in-four older Canadians pick Reagan (26%), only nine per cent of respondents aged 18-34 concur.

Conversely, George W. Bush is regarded as Canada's worst friend among U.S. presidents by almost half of respondents (48%), followed by his father, George H. Bush, and Nixon, both with eight per cent. Respondents in the youngest age group (54%) clearly regard the current White House dweller in a negative light.
